FIRST FLOOR PLAN



Open concept living-dining-kitchen area with 9 foot ceilings throughout.

Large guest room/home office aka Architecture Studio. Kitchen features a $108" \times 45"$ island and booth seating, but no upper cabinets. Open shelving in front of windows provides more light and (in my mind) will force us to be more minimalist. Everyone gets one plate, one bowl and one cup.


SECOND FLOOR PLAN



We created three nicely sized bedrooms, a beautiful semi-private home office, laundry room, reading nook at the top of the stairs, and...oh yeah, perhaps the biggest walk-in closet and shower in all of Takoma Park?!

This is 1,296 sf. The rooms all could have been slightly bigger, but the architect in the family wanted an extra wide stair and hallway.

BUILDING SCIENCE



Exterior walls were framed at 24" on center, eliminating up to 1/3 of the studs required for walls framed at 16" o.c. With 288 linear feet of walls that's a lot of lumber saved!

Framing this way also provides more space for insulation and can reduce the thermal bridging between outdoors and conditioned indoor space.


Window headers were minimally sized or completely eliminated where possible, further reducing the amount of lumber used and increasing the amount of insulation in each wall.



We used an insulated sheathing for this project, creating a continuous layer outside of the studs. This reduces thermal bridging and counteracts the studs reducing the effective R-Value of the typical cavity-only insulation.

The stud cavity was then filled with open cell spray foam.

Code minimum insulation for this project is R13+5 (R13 between the studs, R5 exterior). We used R20+6, significantly exceeding the minimum. Roof insulation minimum was R38, we used R52 closed cell spray foam.



One of the most effective things you can do to create a long-lasting exterior wall assembly is to add an air gap between the siding and the sheathing. This is sometimes referred to as a Rain Screen.

Leaving a space as little as 1/4" can improve the wall's ability to dry, which in turn improves mold resistance. This air space should be open at the top and bottom of the wall to ensure propert airflow and provide an escape for any bulk water that gets through.

There are many ways to create a rainscreen. This particular product is a drainage and ventilation fabric called Mortair Vent. The green is the exterior face of the insulated sheathing. The Mortair Vent is stapled on and then the siding is placed outside of the fabric.






